<p>Counteracting the bias for specifically academic research and academic forms of knowledge by always trying to point out how the research techniques students use for their thesis research do or don't apply to other domains of life.</p>	Be more explicit and consistent in defining the cultural norms for my classroom---what to say when you want to interrupt with a question, etc.
<p>We are explicit about setting classroom (or Zoom class) norms around participation (speaking/typing in the chat during class/hand-raising/ how to ask questions/how to get help/when is it ok to ask for help)</p>
